Another quality of Utkir Khashimov is that the writer never told a lie, never played along with the tyrannical ideology or policy, never betrayed his conscience and never took the path of discord. The collected data and materials are analyzed using the methods of comparative-historical description and classification, widely used in Uzbek literature. By the time Utkir Khashimov began his creative work, the harsh conditions of the authoritarian regime had somewhat softened, society began to democratize, and free thought was partially allowed. However, the opportunity to tell the truth in official circles, on "authoritative" platforms, in science, on radio, television and in the press was still limited. At that time, the task of being the conscience of society and the voice of the working people fell on the shoulders of literature and masters of words.

A. Kakhhor, O. Yakubov, P. Kadyrov and their successors E. Vohidov, A. Oripov, Sh. Kholmirzaev truly showed themselves as heralds of truth, justice, interpreters of the voice of the people.
