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
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is closely linked to a teacher's personal qualities, communicative abilities, and social influence skills.

The research results indicate that future teachers with a high pedagogical image possess the following characteristics:



The graph above illustrates the key psychological factors influencing the pedagogical image of future teachers, expressed in percentage values. The following conclusions can be drawn from the graph:

1. The most significant factor – Communicative competence (89%) A teacher's ability to effectively communicate with students is a fundamental component of pedagogical image. It helps establish a trusting relationship between the teacher and students.

2. Emotional stability (82%)

Teachers' resilience to stress and adaptability are crucial. These qualities enable them to effectively address challenges in the educational process and provide motivational influence on students.





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3. Self-assessment (76%)

Teachers with self-confidence are more capable of establishing effective communication with students. The study results indicate that teachers with a strong pedagogical image tend to have a positive perception of themselves.

4. Empathy and pedagogical ethics (74%)

A teacher's ability to empathize and adhere to pedagogical ethics plays a crucial role in enhancing their reputation. Good communication with students and understanding their emotions contribute to forming a positive teacher image.

5. The influence of the social environment (68%)

Relationships between teachers and colleagues, as well as the overall social environment in educational institutions, significantly impact the pedagogical image. A supportive professional atmosphere fosters its development.

These analyses indicate that communicative competence, emotional stability, and self-assessment are the most critical factors in shaping the pedagogical image of future teachers. Therefore, special training programs should be designed to develop these aspects.

Measures to Enhance the Pedagogical Image of Future Teachers:

Organizing psychological training and seminars – Implementing programs aimed at developing emotional resilience, stress management, and emotional intelligence among teachers.

Developing professional training programs – Regularly involving teachers in professional development courses and academic conferences to enhance their pedagogical competencies.

Focusing on self-improvement – Encouraging teachers to continuously develop their skills and explore new pedagogical technologies and innovations.

Teaching pedagogical ethics and aesthetics – Improving teachers' image by fostering speech culture, professional attire etiquette, pedagogical communication, and ethical behavior.
