## **STABLE DEVELOPMENT AND ECONOMIC GROWTH IN ANGOR DISTRICT**

As of April 1, 2025, the Angor district of Surkhandarya region comprises 36 citizens' assemblies (mahallas), including 26,223 households with 37,515 families. The total population of the district has reached 147.7 thousand people. Under the leadership of Hokim Qosim Mardonov, a wide range of initiatives aimed at ensuring socio-economic stability, improving infrastructure, and promoting entrepreneurship have been successfully implemented in the region.



### **Macroeconomic Indicators and Growth Dynamics**

In 2024, the following key achievements were recorded in the district's economic indicators compared to 2023:

Industrial output: 640.9 billion UZS (growth – 18.3%)

Agricultural production: 2.183 trillion UZS (growth – 1.6%)

Capital investments: 506.7 billion UZS

Contracted construction works: 319.1 billion UZS (growth – 8.47%)

Service sector output: 784.8 billion UZS (growth – 10.8%)

Positive dynamics continued in the first quarter of 2025:

Industrial output: 115.8 billion UZS (growth – 35.2%)

Agricultural production: 337.8 billion UZS (growth – 5.2%)

Capital investments: 1.703 trillion UZS (growth – 641%)

Contracted construction works: 1.027 trillion UZS

Retail turnover: 259.2 billion UZS (growth – 7.25%)

Service sector output: 201.1 billion UZS (growth – 10.6%)



These results reflect the effectiveness of reforms aimed at diversifying the economy, improving the business climate, and accelerating investment projects in the district. Entrepreneurship as a Key Priority



The measures implemented to promote and support private entrepreneurship in Angor district have yielded tangible results. As of the first quarter of 2025, the share of small business entities in the main economic sectors is as follows:

Agriculture – 98.2%

Retail trade – 97.3%

Construction – 90.8%

Capital investments – 99.5%

Service sector – 76.9%

Industry – 56.1%

During the same period, 62 new small business entities (excluding farms and household plots) were established.

Sectoral distribution of newly established small businesses:

Trade – 50.8%

Industry – 21.0%

Accommodation and food services – 8.1%

Healthcare and social services – 1.6%

Transportation and logistics – 1.6%

Construction – 3.2%
