



IMPROVING THE LEGAL REGULATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL INSURANCE AND THE IMPORTANCE OF INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

As in every sphere, issues of international cooperation are of great importance in the field of ecology, in particular in relations related to environmental protection and compensation for damage caused to it. Modern international environmental cooperation is carried out in three directions:

- 1) interstate cooperation in environmental protection and wide dissemination of positive experiences in them;
- 2) development of scientifically based measures for regional nature conservation in a certain geographical area (region) or limited areas and their practical implementation;
- 3) use of universal methods in finding solutions to global environmental problems through UN agencies, state and non-state organizations.

Environmental protection at the international level is carried out not only through ecological requirements, but also by incorporating social, political, and economic requirements. However, theoretically, environmental protection standards should only take into account international ecological relations. Because ecological problems are inextricably linked with global problems - human rights, economic, energy, food, education, etc. Since each of them is directly or indirectly related to ecological relations, they are considered as a single problem among local, regional, and global issues.

The national activities of the Republic of Uzbekistan in the field of nature protection are carried out in conjunction with the work of wide and comprehensive cooperation with other states and international organizations. A large number of various international treaties and agreements have been concluded regulating various aspects of environmental protection and rational use of nature. If we consider the direct

cooperation of the Republic of Uzbekistan with the international community, it should be noted that one of the basic principles of international law in this area is the obligation of states to cooperate with each other. Therefore, Uzbekistan, as a full member of the international community, has been participating in international relations based on this principle.

One of the international cooperation areas that we mentioned above is interstate cooperation and the wide dissemination of positive experiences in them. Carrying out work in this area is of great importance in regulating relations related to environmental insurance. For example, in Uzbekistan, in order to regulate environmental insurance relations, strengthen the legal basis of these relations, an in-depth study of the experience of advanced foreign countries and their implementation in our legislation are important factors. In the above paragraph, we studied the legal regime of environmental insurance using the example of a number of developed foreign countries, in particular, the USA, Germany, South Korea, China, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan. In reflecting the norms related to environmental insurance in our national legislation, one of the main tasks is to study the experience of the countries listed above, conduct comparative analyses, and study the needs that can be reflected in our legislation.
